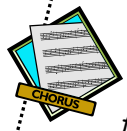


# Extra Curricular Activities

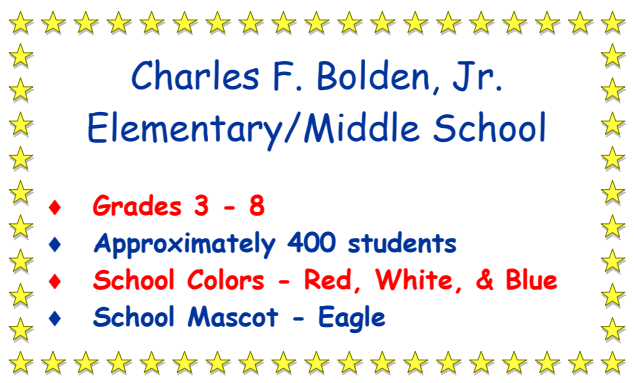
## Sign Language Club

## Eligibility

Bolden Elementary/Middle provides education to those military dependants occupying permanent living quarters in the Tri-Command area.



## Registration

## Instructional Support

For those students requiring extra academic support, Bolden Elementary/Middle offers the following programs:

**Read 180**– This is a DoDEA mandated program for those students not meeting the standards in language arts. Ms. Haught provides instruction to those students 5 days a week in 90 minute sessions.

**Math Support**– Our math facilitator, Ms. Stephens works with both teachers and students to increase math achievement.

**ESL (English as a Second Language)** - Instruction is provided to those students needing support according to the DoDEA guidelines

## Gifted Education

Students identified for Gifted Education are provided with activities and instruction to enrich and extend the curriculum through a pullout model program. Ms. Holley provides many exciting projects and activities to challenge the students.

## Special Education

Bolden Elementary/Middle has two teachers which serve our special needs students. The instructional goals are determined by those students' Individualized Education Plan. The model for instruction is determined by the least restrictive environment for the student.

In addition, a physical therapist, an occupational therapist, a school psychologist and speech language pathologist are also available to those students who may require these services.
