- 248.997      **AMISH-PEOPLE OF PRESERVATION** - EBC - 27 min. I-J-H  
Subject Area: Social Studies  
This documentary captures the sensitivity and humility of the Amish people, and examines their religious beliefs, closeness to nature, and strong sense of community.
- 291.17      **AMERICAN EXPERIENCE: RELIGIOUS DIVERSITY** - BFA - 19 min. I-J-H  
Subject Area: U.S. History, Civics  
Through this film, we meet young people involved in seven of America's major religious groups, and viewers will be able to observe some of the differences and similarities that exist within America's religious diversity.

Hercules, having been brought to Olympus and made a god at the end of his earthly life, lives now on the mountain top amid pleasant peace and predictability.

Subject Area: Literature, Language  
The myths of ancient Greece and Rome were stories about gods and man invented in an attempt to explain natural phenomena and man's behavior.

Subject Area: Literature  
The myth of Phaeton comes to life in this vividly animated film. Phaeton, son of the sun god, begs to be allowed to drive the chariot of the sun across the sky.

Subject Area: Literature, Language Arts
