




CHILD FIND/SPECIAL EDUCATION

Child Find

CHILD FIND is an ongoing process used by all schools in the Department of Defense to identify children and youth with disabilities from birth through age 21 who may be eligible to receive special education and related services because of developmental delays or disabilities.

School Age

If your children are attending one of the schools on a military installation and you have concerns regarding their academics, social, emotional, physical or speech language development, please contact the local school personnel for assistance.



Pre School

Parents with preschool children ages 3-4 that have a suspected disability in the areas of speech and language development, social/emotional development, cognitive or physical development would also contact the local school personnel for assistance.



EDIS

Special Education

The Child Find process may lead to a formal Assessment for the identification of a disability. A Case Study Committee will be formed to guide the process and may determine that your child needs special education and related services. Special education is specially designed instruction to meet the unique needs of any student with a disability. Special education services include specially designed instruction support, equipment, related services, Assistive technology and any other services that enhance the regular education program. These services are available to children 3 years old through age 21 determined to be eligible for special education.
