

Homework Tips

Let your child know that homework is important.

Set a regular time each day allowing time to unwind after school.

Be sure your child has needed supplies.

Help your child get organized by providing a student planner that includes a calendar and a daily assignment sheet.

Ensure your child has a quiet, clean, and well lit place to study.

Discourage distractions including television and phone calls.

Be available to answer questions, but keep homework as his or her responsibility to complete.

Spot check homework when completed.

Contact teacher if homework problems occur.



► What is School Counseling?



School counseling is an integral part of each school district's total education program. It is a comprehensive program that includes sequential activities provided in pre-Kindergarten through grade 12. These activities are organized and implemented by certified professional school counselors with the active support of parents, students, teachers, and administrators.

In concert with Goal 1, Highest Student Achievement, of the DoDEA Community Strategic Plan, school counselors are strategically positioned to help students in developing strategies to deal with daily challenges that may interfere with the educational process.

Fort Bragg School Counselors provide:

A DoDEA Competency-Based Counseling Program that promotes and enhances student learning by focusing on three interrelated areas: Academic Development, Career Development and Personal/Social Development. This program is organized to promote effective efficient resources utilization and provide accountability for student achievement.

Fort Bragg School Counselors help by:

- Assisting students to develop self awareness and individual goals.
- Counseling with students individually and in groups to develop communication and interpersonal skills needed to relate to others.
- Counseling students regarding career planning and preparation.
- Assisting students cope with deployments, reunions, moves, and other transitions in life.
- Working collaboratively with students, parents, and teachers to identify and remove barriers that interfere with student achievement.



Fort Bragg School Counselors are certified professionals who possess a master's degree or higher in school counseling, and are uniquely qualified to address the developmental needs of all students.



Professional school counselors (formerly referred to as guidance counselors) have taken advanced coursework in career development, human growth and development, individual counseling, group counseling, testing/appraisal and had a supervised internship.
