




BAS: Based on DoDEA performance standards chart and Fountas & Pinnell chart that breaks it down by month

In Nov. when most students were assessed, a child should have been reading at a level A to meet expectations. Students above that Exceed expectations; Students below level A are approaching the expectations at this time.


