




ACTIVITY What's Your Number?

Materials: 9 small snap-lock plastic bags; 99 small objects that can be counted easily, such as acorns, pebbles, or bottle caps; marking pen; index cards or slips of paper

- Write on each bag: 1 ten.
- Have your child count 10 items into each bag and snap it closed.
- Take some of the filled plastic bags and some of the loose items. Place them in front of your child.
- Have your child write how many tens and how many ones there are, then write the number.
- Ask your child to repeat the activity. This time, you record the tens and ones and the number.
- Take turns doing this activity.
- Save the bags and the loose items to use for comparing numbers and for adding and subtracting two-digit numbers.
