### **Child Nutrition Programs - Children need healthy meals to learn.**

Camp Lejeune Dependents Schools offer healthy meals every school day. Full Price *Breakfast* for students in PreK -12 costs \$1.25; *Lunch* for PreK-5 costs \$2.25; *Lunch* for grades 6-12 is \$2.35.

The **Free & Reduced Price Meal Program** is available for families who need assistance in paying for their child's meals. Applications for school meal benefits are available at all school offices and may be completed and submitted any time.

For children who qualify for free or reduced price meals, the Reduced price for breakfast is 30 cents; and the Reduced price for lunch is 40 cents for all students.

Parents of Camp Lejeune students who received benefits last school year **must complete a new application** for the 2009-2010 school year. If a new application for SY 2009-10 is not **filed by September 25**, parents are responsible for paying for any meals charged at the full price until a new application is completed, submitted and processed.

A la carte items such as extras of menu items, bottled water, juice, pretzels, yogurt and school baked items are also available. Adults are welcome to select from the menu at the a la carte rate.

A central menu is published every other month. All schools offer the central menu on a daily basis. In addition to the central menu, individual schools may feature additional choices to complement the published menu.

### **SCHOOL MEAL ACCOUNTS**

Every child that attends Camp Lejeune Dependents Schools is assigned his/her own school meal account. Parents are **highly encouraged to prepay** for their child's meals. Parents may pre-pay for their child's meals and view their child's school meal account at [www.lunchprepay.com](http://www.lunchprepay.com) . Students may charge meals only in emergency situations. There is a limit of \$10.00 that may be charged on a child's account. If a child has charged, parents will be notified. Prompt payment of charges is expected and appreciated.

## STUDENT REGISTRATION AT CAMP LEJEUNE DEPENDENTS SCHOOLS

Camp Lejeune Dependents Schools' student registration for school year 2009-2010 is in progress for students in Grades Preschool through 12.

Dependent children, living with their military sponsor in assigned quarters, and who are 4-years-old **BY SEPTEMBER 1, 2009**, are eligible for the  $\frac{1}{2}$  day Preschool Program. The half-day Preschool Programs are:

Delalio Elementary if living in housing at MCAS-NR  
Tarawa Terrace I Primary School if living in Tarawa Terrace I, II and Midway Park housing  
Johnson Primary School living in family housing aboard MCB-CL

Dependent children, living with their military sponsor in assigned quarters, and are **5-years-old BY SEPTEMBER 1, 2009** are eligible for Kindergarten. Kindergarten programs are \*:

\*Delalio Elementary, grades PreK-5 living in the MCAS-NR family housing  
\*Tarawa Terrace I School, grades PreK-1 living in Tarawa Terrace I and Midway Park  
\*Tarawa Terrace II Elementary, grades K-5 living in Tarawa Terrace II  
Tarawa Terrace II Elementary, grades 2-5 living in Midway Park family  
\*Johnson Primary School, grades PreK-2 residing on mainside  
Bitz Intermediate School, grades 3-5 residing on mainside

All recognized, legal dependents residing in permanent, assigned family housing in all Camp Lejeune/New River areas in grades 6, 7 and 8 attend Brewster Middle School, while students in grades 9-12 will attend Lejeune High School.

**REQUIREMENTS AT INITIAL REGISTRATION** for the biological children of the active duty member include:

1) the child's certified birth certificate; 2) immunization record; 3) family housing voucher; and 4) sponsor's PCS orders (or other verification of active duty status).

Stepchildren or non-biological legal, recognized **dependents** of the active duty member must be approved by the District Registrar at the Superintendent's Office, 855 Stone Street, Camp Lejeune prior to enrollment in school. Before authorization to enroll will be granted, the following documentation must be presented:

1) the child's original, certified birth certificate; 2) sponsor's DDForm 1746, Application for Assignment to Housing; 3) family housing voucher or completed lease agreement; 4) custody document showing spouse has legal custody of the child

Failure to provide required documents will delay the child's enrollment in school.

New students enrolling in grades 1 through 12 should provide the name and address of the previous school attended along with the last report card or withdrawal grades from that school.

Parents of new students may visit the school offices to register, between 0800 - 1500, Monday through Friday. If you are unsure of your district school, please contact the Office of the Superintendent for confirmation, 451-2461.

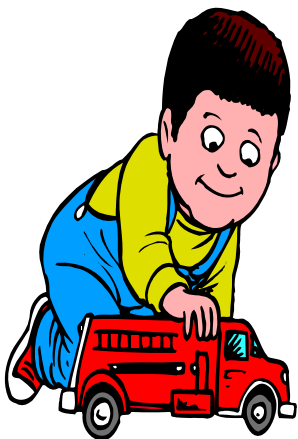
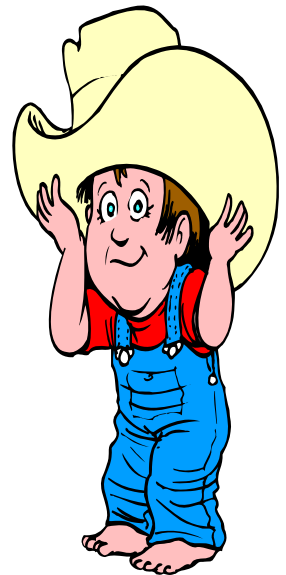
# Free Preschool Program and Free Screening Offered By *Camp Lejeune Dependents Schools*



Camp Lejeune Dependents Schools' has a preschool program for children who will be four years old by September 1, 2009 **and** who live in base housing or whose sponsor holds a 90 day housing letter. The preschool program is located at Johnson Primary School, Tarawa Terrace I Primary, and Delalio Elementary.

The only exceptions to the age requirement are for children three or four years old that have developmental delays and have an Individualized Education Program (IEP) by the Camp Lejeune Dependents Schools specifying preschool education as a service.

**Preschool is a half-day program on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Fridays.** There is a morning and afternoon session each of these days. Wednesdays are set aside for parent workshops, home visits, parent-teacher conferences, team planning and for staff development activities. There is no fee for attending this program. Transportation is provided for children who live 1.5 or more miles from the school, who attend a Base Child Development Center or have transportation listed as a needed service on an IEP.



If your child meets the housing and age requirements for the preschool program and you would like to enroll him/her, registration is now taking place at all of the elementary schools. If your child is three or four years old and you have concerns about any area of his/her development and would like a free screening, you may contact **Student Services at the Superintendent's Office at 451-2461 ext. 220 or 241 to schedule an appointment.**

As an elected member, you will be assigned as a school liaison to one of CLDS' seven schools and expected to attend the monthly school board meetings, traditionally held the third Wednesday of each month.
