North Carolina State University (919-515-2421)

Need-based awards:

Complete the FAFSA as soon as possible after January 1.

Merit Awards:

Chancellor's Leadership Award (\$2,500 per year. A merit and need-based recognition award which rewards needy students who have demonstrated academic success, leadership, and special achievement throughout high school. North Carolina Wesleyan College (252-985-5290)

Need-based awards:

Complete the FAFSA as soon as possible after January 1.

Merit Awards: Accepted high school seniors are considered for the following merit awards:

Trustee Scholarship (full tuition; top 10% rank or GPA of at least 3.75 and 1150 SAT or 25 ACT)

Valedictorian Scholarship (full tuition, valedictorian of high school class)

President's Scholarship (up to \$7,500; 3.5 GPA and 1100 SAT or 24 ACT)

Dean's Scholarship (up to \$6,700; 3.0 GPA and 1000 SAT or 24 ACT)

Wesleyan Scholarship (up to \$6,300; 3.0 GPA and 900 SAT or 19 ACT)

Merit Award (up to \$5,800; 2.5 GPA and 800 SAT or 17 ACT)

Wesleyan Grant (up to \$4,000; need-based, FAFSA required)

Honors Scholarship (\$1,000; 3.25 GPA and 1100 SAT or 24 ACT)

Methodist Grant (\$500; member of the United Methodist Church)

University of North Carolina at Greensboro (336-334-5702)

Need-based awards:

Complete the FAFSA by March 1

Merit awards:

Current high school seniors must present a minimum SAT I score of 1200 or ACT score of 26 and an overall high school GPA of 3.5 or above. Award amounts range from \$2,500 to \$15,000 per year and may be renewed for up to a total of four years. On-campus interviews are required and are held in February. Special awards are available in business, English, mathematics, physics, and chemistry. A single application provides consideration for all of the awards. University of North Carolina at Pembroke (910-521-6255)

Need-based awards:

Complete the FAFSA as soon as possible after January 1 and before March 15..

Merit awards:

Submit a common merit scholarship application by March 1. The following awards are available to entering freshmen:

Valedictorian Scholarship (a one-time award covering tuition and fees for any student who graduates as valedictorian)

Incentive Scholarship (up to \$3,000 per year; available to students who graduate from a North Carolina high school and rank in the top 25% of the class)

Alumni Scholarship (amounts vary; for sons and daughters of UNCP alumni)

UNC Pembroke Endowed Scholarships (primarily for upperclassmen; 50 scholarships are awarded through the academic departments; amounts vary according to qualifications and need.)
